How's it Possible...

Most people are aware that spiders build webs, but did you know that webs were made of silk? Silk is released from spinnerets on the abdomen of their body. These spinnerets have silk glands within them that help produce what is used to make the web. The silk comes out in two forms. One form is stiff and dry so it can be used to make the web itself. The second form of silk starts out as a liquid and is super sticky. It is used to capture food for the spider. A spider's web is as strong as steel but also as stretchy as a rubber band. While humans can break webs with ease, bugs cannot. Some spiders make webs in caves or in tall grass, while others make them on the porch of a house. Spiders also sometimes eat the webs they make to replenish their own silk supply. Spiders are skillful engineers, gifted with amazing planning skills, and their webs have creative designs.

When Did That Happen...

On April 6, 1896, the first modern Olympic Games were held in Athens, Greece. The atmosphere was festive, with more than 60,000 spectators welcoming foreign athletes with parades and banquets. Fourteen nations competed in 43 events with a total of 241 male athletes in the competition. The events ranged from track and field, cycling, swimming, gymnastics, weightlifting, wrestling, fencing, and tennis. The first modern Olympic champion was an American, James Connolly. He won the triple jump on opening day and was awarded a silver medal and an olive branch. Today the Olympic Games continue, having expanded to 206 countries, with the inclusion of female athletes.


