Where in the World...

Next year, it's the 90th anniversary of the most regional product since sliced bread! The story of a block called Lego in Danish it's called "LEG GODT" which means to play well. Lego was founded in Denmark during the Great Depression of 1932, by a father of four boys. Kirk Christiansen was a poor carpenter that went bankrupt. Therefore, he saved some wood to make toys and it turned out to be a huge success. However, he did not use the Lego name until 1934. In 1949, Lego made its first blocks that we recognize today. They did not make licensed toys until 1999 to promote the Lego Star Wars movie collaboration. Lego now makes video games and has their own theme park. Kirk Christiansen would be proud!

How's it Possible...

It's nothing like seeing a slam dunk in basketball, but how did the slam dunk come to be? Who was the first person to dunk the ball into the hoop? Well, in 1944, Bob Kurland of Oklahoma A & M now known as Oklahoma State University dunked at an NCAA basketball game against Temple. But while Kurland is credited with being the first dunk in college basketball, the first professional basketball dunk actually came 8 years earlier from the NBA's Joe Fortenberry. It happened while he was training for the 1936 Olympics in Berlin, Germany. Although these were the first two record dunks in history, the move didn't gain traction until the 1960's when players like Wilt Chamberlain, Bill Russell, Dr. J. Julius Erving, Kareem-Abdul Jabbar and Darryl Dawkins started using the move in games. Dunks have become so popular that Slam Dunk Contests are now held annually in the NBA.


