

# Where in the World...

Every winter in Sapparo, Japan, there is a giant snow festival that is visited by many people from Japan and around the world. Sapparo is turned into a winter dream world with the International Snow Sculpture Contest that has taken place since 1974. In 1983, the third site at Susukino was opened, adding a new addition to the festival with the ice sculptures, illuminated by the neon street lights. In 1984, the duration of the festival was extended from 5 days to 7 full days. Even visitors from America and Canada were traveling halfway around the world to visit this extravagant attraction, which draws in nearly 2 million people every year.

## How's it Possible...

Did you know that a recent invention called "Solar Roadways" could change the way we drive? Solar Roadways are specially engineered solar panels that can be walked and driven upon. The solar wafers are protected under thick layers of shatter proof gorilla glass and can generate electricity from any surface. The solar panels can be used to pave roads, driveways, sidewalks or any surface meant for walking. The goal is to charge electric vehicles with clean energy from the sun, first with solar parking lots and hopefully highway infrastructure while driving. One day, solar panels will be available for highways, but first will come non-critical applications such as driveways and parking lots. Solar roadways will also help with the prevention of greenhouse gases.

# When Did That Happen...

In 1968 astronauts Frank Borman, Jim Lovell and William Anders spent the night before Christmas orbiting the moon. The three astronauts became the first men to leave Earth's gravitational pull, the first to orbit the moon, and the first to view all of Earth from space and the first to see the dark side of the moon. Apollo 8 is perhaps best remembered today for the broadcast the three astronauts made when they entered the moon's orbit on Christmas Eve. As viewers were shown pictures of the moon and Earth from lunar orbit. The broadcast ended with the famous line "Merry Christmas, and God bless all of you, all of you on the good Earth". This became one of the most watched television events in history.




