Where in the World...

Have you ever been to Paris? Well, if you go, then you need to go visit the Louvre, the largest art museum in the world. It has an area of 782,910 square feet. In the 12th century, the Louvre was considered to be a historic palace and the first to serve as a fortress in 1546. The Louvre first belonged to King Louis XIV in 1692, and was used to house two art academies. More than 100 years later, it opened with 537 paintings. Today, the Louvre is home to around 38,000 pieces of artwork. The Louvre is the most visited museum in the world, receiving 7.4 million visitors every year.

How's it Possible...

Most people love salt water taffies, but did you ever wonder when and how it got its name? Salt water taffy is a variety of soft taffy originally produced and marketed in Atlantic City, New Jersey, beginning in the late 19th century. The story goes that David Bradley's candy shop was flooded with water from the Atlantic Ocean in 1883, and a young girl came into his shop wanting some taffy. He gave her a new taffy called "salt-water taffy", a sample of one of the taffies that were caught in the storm. She enjoyed it so much that she bought a sample to show off to her friends. David's mother who was in the shop overheard the conversation, and stated that she liked his name for the taffy. The name stuck, and that was how the salt-water taffy got its name! It is also important to say that the salt water taffy of today is not made with saltwater.

When Did That Happen...

On February 4, 1913, civil rights leader Rosa Parks was born. Rosa Parks was an activist who worked to achieve equal rights for all Americans. Rosa Parks' refusal to give up her seat on a segregated bus led to the Montgomery Bus Boycott. Her bravery led to nationwide efforts to give equal rights to all Americans. Parks was awarded the Martin Luther King Jr. Award by the NAACP, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, and the Congressional Gold Medal.

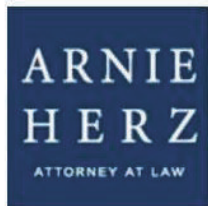

In August 2018, an amazing 16 yr old started a school strike for climate change, outside the Swedish Parliament. Since then, it has spread all over the world, and now involves over 100,000 school-children. Greta Thunberg's movement is now called "Fridays For the Future." The amazing teen, who is on the autism spectrum, has spoken at climate rallies in Stockholm, Helsinki, Brussels, and Sweden. As an environmental activist, Greta was given the 2019 "Right Livelihood Award." The international award was established in 1980 to "honor courageous people solving global problems." She will also be awarded 1 million Swedish krona (\$103,000).

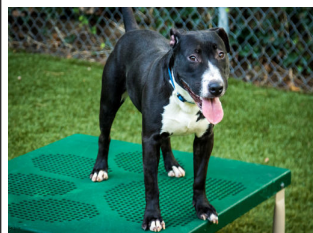

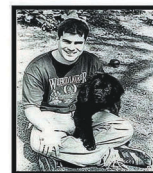
