Where in the World...

Prior to European settlement, the Australian Aborigines developed a range of unique musical instruments, including the didgeridoo and clapsticks. These unique musical instruments were used in their traditional ceremonies. These instruments and their distinctive sounds are today incorporated with traditional music in a fusion of contemporary mainstream styles. They are performed by Australian indigenous artists such as Gurrumul yunupingu and yothu yindi. Some of the earliest music of Australia in our convict nation told of the hardships experienced by the first settlers and had it's celtic folk music. Songs such as "Bound for Botany Bay" described the period in the late 18th and 19th centuries when British convicts were decorated to the various Australian penal colonies.

What's Going on Here...

<u>July</u> The Town of North Hempstead will continue its drive-in movie series at town facilities for the summer. The program is expected to take place every Saturday and Sunday after sundown. Films will be projected onto large outdoor screens for residents to enjoy a night out, while also following social distancing protocols. While registration is free for these events, the town is encouraging attendees to bring non-perishable, canned foods to each showing as part of North Hempstead's donation drive. 
