

Where in the World...

Japan is known for many things but most importantly for being the origin of anime. Anime began in the late 1910s. The first film was made using chalk and was less than 5 minutes long. This way of animating continued until it was discovered that using paper cutouts instead of chalk was less labor-intensive. The paper cutout anime films were silent and accompanied by music or a "Benshi" which was essentially a narrator. The first anime to take on the 25-minute format of traditional TV was *Tetsuwan Atom* (Astro Boy), in international markets. The 1980s are considered the "golden age" of anime. The introduction of VHS was instrumental in the expansion of anime films globally. At that time Studio Ghibli was formed by Hayo Miyazaki. His 2001 film *Spirited Away* won an Academy Award for best-animated feature and is the only anime film to do so. *Dragon Ball Z*, an anime show released in the 80's, is now considered a nostalgia for the 80's and 90's kids around the world. Anime films and shows to this day continue to grow and be seen all over the world.

What's Going on Here...

June: The Town of North Hempstead will continue its drive-in movie series at town facilities for the summer. The program is expected to take place every Saturday and Sunday after sundown. Films will be projected onto large outdoor screens for residents to enjoy a night out, while also following social distancing protocols. While registration is free for these events, the town is encouraging attendees to bring non-perishable, canned foods to each showing as part of North Hempstead's donation drive. Residents are being asked to register their cars in advance by visiting NorthHempsteadNY.gov/drive-in or calling 311. Dates for movie showings can also be found on the town website.

The North Hempstead Beach is currently only open to town residents. There are no parking fees for the 2020 season. All visitors are asked to maintain social distancing guidelines and to wear a mask when possible.

How's it Possible...

Did you know? The platypus has a sixth sense called electroreception, which is used to hunt their prey. They use their incredible bill which has many sensory cells to detect movements and subtle electric fields that their prey emits. Platypi have two different receptors that allow this sense to work. The electroreceptors are used to track the electrical signals sent by the breathing of its prey which are insects, larvae, shellfish, and worms. The other is a mechanoreceptor used to detect changes in pressure and motion in the water. Since platypi have no teeth they use gravel to help break apart their food. The electroreceptors in the platypus's bill number at about 40,000, the highest number of electroreceptors of any animal. Pretty cool, huh?

When Did That Happen...

On June 14, 1777, former president George Washington and the founding fathers officially designated the stars we know today as the American flag. This day is now known as "Flag Day". Although this day is not a federal holiday, it was declared a day of recognition by former president Woodrow Wilson in 1916. People and businesses are encouraged to put flags outside where they reside. Parades are held around the country in observance of this day. The largest parade is held in Troy, NY which draws over 50,000 spectators. On Flag Day, Americans are to honor the meaning of the holiday by visiting a memorial or learning more about American history. You can also celebrate with your family by attending a Flag Day parade or hosting a dinner party for your friends and family.
