Where in the World...

In Mexico, many native traditions and cultures are being kept by their current generation. Most people are aware that the main language spoken in this country is Spanish, but did you know that there are many different indigenous languages? Six percent of Mexicans continue to speak in their native languages that originated centuries ago. These languages are Maya, Pima, Otomi, Teenek, Ayapaneco, and Zoque. Indigenous Mexican words have even become common in other languages, including English. Food that is popular with Americans, are considered traditional foods in Mexico, chocolate, coyote, tomato, and avocado all came from the Nahuatl people, also known as the Aztecs. Native Mexicans drink chocolate because it symbolizes royalty. It is tradition to give their friends or family chocolate as a way to say thank you. Native Mexican culture is also displayed in clothing. Women wear embroidery often including images and patterns that have symbolic meaning attached to them. Men wear a large blanket cape called a sarape, and boots as a wardrobe staple. No matter what part of the world you are from, it is amazing to see cultures and traditions passed down from generation to generation.

How's it Possible...

Did you know corned beef and cabbage is not a traditional Irish dish? It was started by Irish Americans in the 19th century. After immigrating from Ireland to the United States, the Irish had a hard time in their new country. Pork in the United States was far more expensive than in Ireland and being poor and in a new country, the Irish had to adapt. The Irish started frequenting the Jewish food establishments in their neighborhoods and found corned beef to be similar to the pork they ate at home. They used corned beef with cabbage instead of potatoes because cabbage was more cost-effective. Corned beef and cabbage was not only a cheap dish but was also incredibly difficult to mess up. Because of this, it took off outside the Irish communities and bustled around the United States. It became so popular that it was eaten at Abraham Lincoln's inauguration dinner in 1862.

When Did That Happen...

In February 1980, president Jimmy Carter issued the first presidential proclamation declaring the week of March 1980 as National Women's History Week. Women's History Month began as a local celebration in Santa Rosa, California. The month is set aside to honor women's contributions in American history. In 1903, Marie Curie became the first woman to receive a Nobel Prize. The chemist and physicist is most famous for her pioneering work in the field of radioactivity. In 1932, Amelia Earhart flew solo across the Atlantic. Amelia Earhart set many aviation records and became the first woman to receive the distinguished flying cross. A ten minute flight in 1920 forged her passion for flying. In 1955, Rosa Parks helped to achieve equal rights for all women.
