Where in the World...

Some of the most fascinating and rhythmic music in Central America is found in the Garifuna communities spread along the Caribbean coast of Belize, Honduras, Guatemala, and Nicaragua. Garifuna is a culture of mixed ethnicities whose origin began in West Africa. Drumming in Garifuna culture is very vital. In fact, if there are no drums, there is no life to the music. The drums represent the heart and soul in Garifuna music. It adds life and meaning to the songs. Garifuna musicians preserve and create their own distinct music by using both a common Arawak-based language and many dances. The name of these dances is Bunda (Punta) Hugu-Hugu, Chumba, and Paranda, just to name a few. The Garifuna language belongs to the Arawak group of languages and has survived for centuries. The written texts of the Garifuna language are a treasure trove of the history and knowledge of the Garifuna culture. The written texts include instructions on how to grow cassava, how to fish, and how to build canoes and houses.

What's Going on Here...

<u>May 23rd</u>: The Town of North Hempstead has announced the launch of a new drive-in move series at town facilities for the summer. Films will be projected onto large outdoor screens for residents to enjoy a night out, while also following social distancing protocols. The first movie to be shown will be "The Goonies" at North Hempstead Beach Park in Port Washington. While registration is free for these events, the town is encouraging attendees to bring non-perishable, canned foods to each showing as part of North Hempstead's donation drive. How's it Possible...

Big Ben is one of the most famous landmarks in the world. However, most people do not know that they have been getting the iconic tower's name wrong. The name at first did not refer to the exceptional 320-foot high tower on the north side of the British Houses of Parliament. It was given the new name Elizabeth Tower in admiration of Queen Elizabeth II, during her diamond celebration in 2012. The first version of the Big Ben cast for the tower arrived in London in 1856, but it cracked before it could ever be put in place. Others believe it is named after Sir Benjamin Hall, a Welsh civil engineer and a member of the House of Commons. This is due to his name being inscribed on the bell. Go figure!

When Did That Happen...

Back in the day, only men were allowed to play many sports such as



basketball. In 1896, nine women from the Stanford University basketball team became the world's first women's intercollegiate basketball team. Basketball was invented by James Naismith in 1892, in that same year, basketball became popular among women. Therefore, the Smith College instructor adopted new rules to make basketball women-friendly. Stanford University decided to put an end to women's intercollegiate team sports because they were concerned about their health. The athletes at Stanford were upset so they decided to take on the University of California to fight for the women's right to play professional basketball. It took many decades and the implementation of Federal Title IX in 1972 before women's sports at Stanford and the rest of America were able to play professional intercollegiate sports.




