

Should they go <u>over</u> the doorway? NO!






They go **through** the doorway!

How does trump get to the house?


Should he go <u>over</u> the grass? NO!

How does the boat get to the lighthouse?


Does it go <u>over</u> the bridge? NO!

Does it go <u>through</u> the bridge? NO!






How should the children get to their mommy?



Should they go <u>through</u> the bridge? NO!


They go over the bridge.

Could it go <u>under</u> the tunnel? NO!




How should the rooster get past the haystack to reach the cow?
