Change can be good or evil

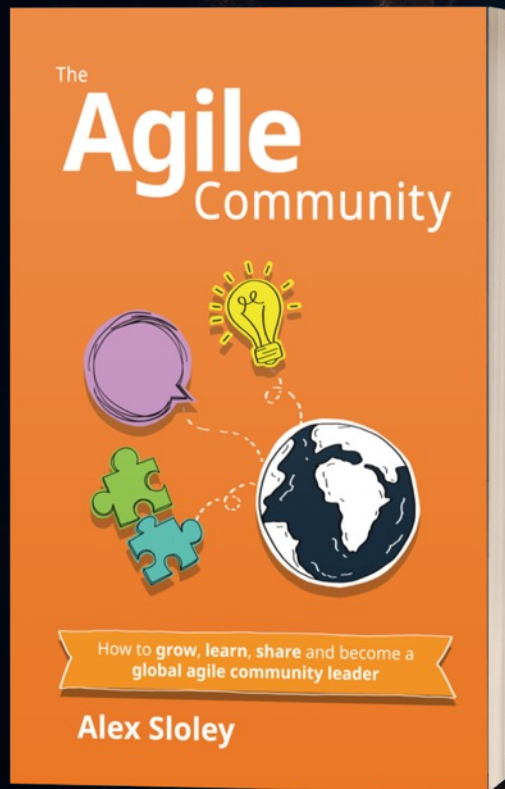
