
PLAYGROUP WELCOMES NEW FAMILIES!

FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER NOW DISTRIBUTES NARCAN

Naloxone/Narcan is a drug used to reverse an opioid overdose, including overdoses due to fentanyl. It is available without a prescription. After a quick training, anyone can administer naloxone to another person who has overdosed on opioids. Naloxone is available for free at the San Juan Ridge Family Resource Center.
