TIP OF THE MONTH from 40 Assets Children as Resources

Thinking of children as providing resources vs draining resources will reward them & you. This will vary according to the young ones' ages and abilities. Have them participate in anything that affects them.

Use "our" instead of "my"; our home, our car, our yard. Ask them to suggest ways they can contribute; for the youngest you may need to offer a choice of age appropriate tasks. This can work with meals, chores, expenses, scheduling, planning for projects, trips, & more. Tasks should be meaningful and clearly a part of the overall effort to the young person. (Easiest to start when children are young; challenging & requiring tact when starting with teenagers)
