Reading with your kids
Children learn
words by your speaking and
reading to them, and by their
own reading as they
get older. The more words a
child knows, the better they
will do in school. If you
read to your child 1-2
times/week before
kindergarten, they will have

63,570 words, 3-5 times/week
169,520 words, no early reading
4,662 words by the time they
start school. (Journal of
Developmental and
Behavioral Pediatrics) Early
reading also promotes reading
for pleasure throughout their
school lives and beyond.

Older children who have not discovered the joy and benefits of reading, need encouragement to start. Find anything they will enjoy reading, something to do with their hobbies, sports, music & other arts. Anything. The goal is to get them reading.
