Thursday morning we spent touring the Greenfield Village and the Ford Museum.

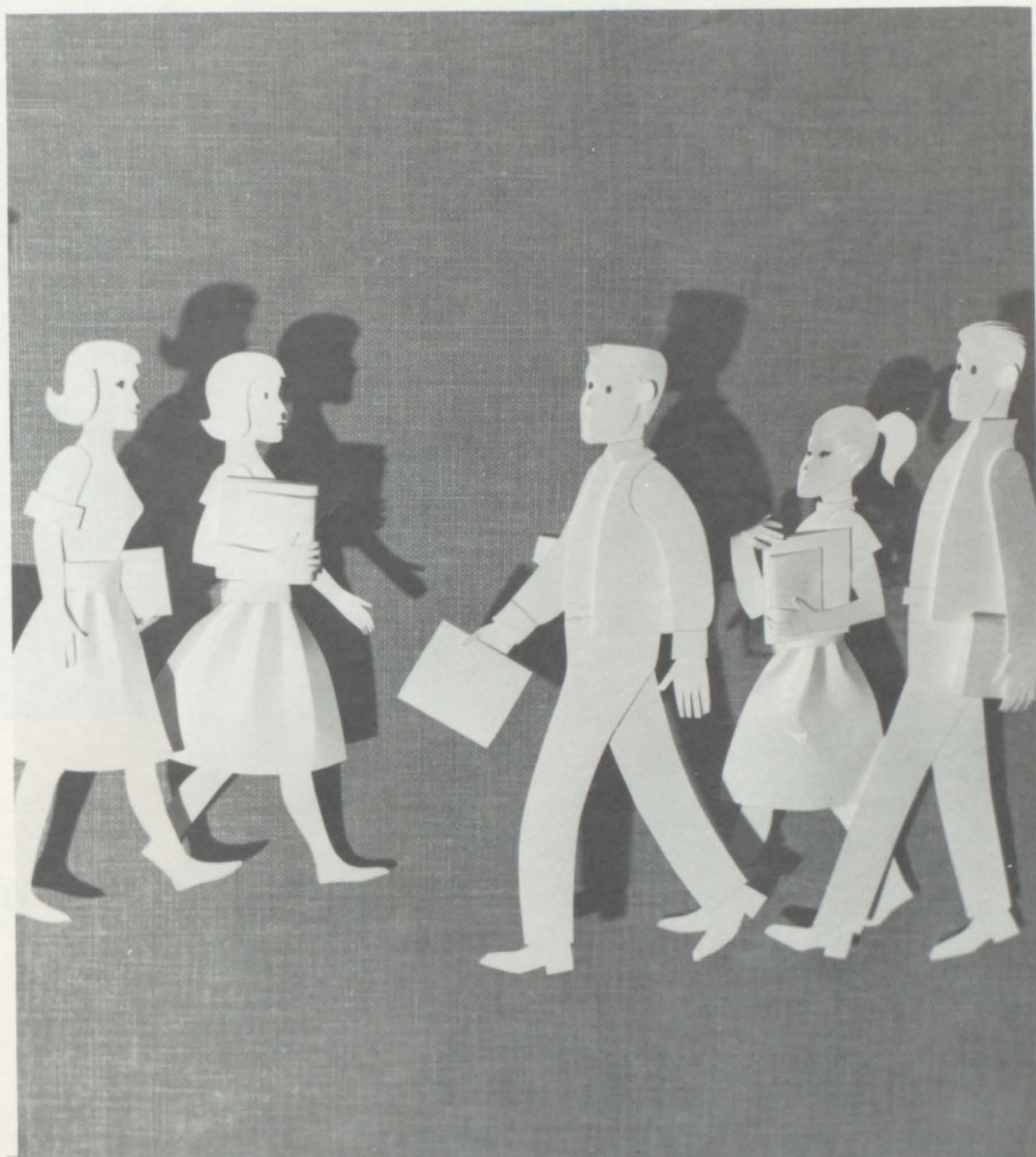
The Ford Plant was viewed in the afternoon. We saw the Rouge Plant where they heat the steel for the cars.

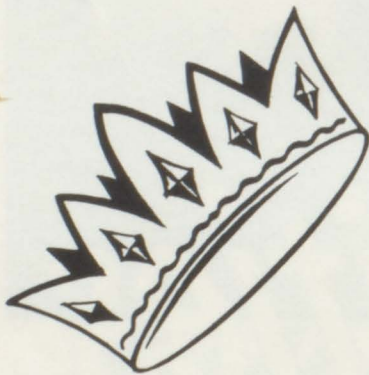


The football boys had the privilege of selecting six senior girls, from which one would reign as Homecoming Queen of 1963.

A very enjoyable and memorable evening was enjoyed by all.

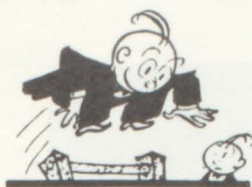
