Attendees will learn the most common ways an appraisal can mislead, such as the use of techniques like "death by a thousand cuts" or the omission. You will also learn what questions to ask the appraiser and exactly what you can do about it, if the report is found to be faulty. This seminar is structured for all levels of assessment professionals and will cover both residential and commercial reports. We will be involved in case studies so blow the dust off your calculator and bring it to class.
