If you are not able to attend the fall conference, and find that you still need to satisfy your requirements for continuing education, might I suggest you consider attending one of our many remaining one-day seminars that we hold via Zoom? No matter, I hope that you enjoy the last few weeks of your summer. For me, John Mayer summed it up rather eloquently, when he said "cause a little bit of summer is what the whole year is about."

Legislative Update

In case you missed it, Gov. Kathy Hochul recently signed into law two bills that affect property tax exemptions for seniors and first-time homebuyers. Bill S.3085A/A.3956A now allows municipalities to increase the maximum income eligible for New York's real property tax exemption to \$50,000 for people aged 65 and over and people with disabilities. Bill S.8890/A.9135 extends the option for local municipalities to provide a property tax exemption for first-time homebuyers purchasing newly constructed homes through 2028. The option had been set to expire at the end of this year.

Bill A3491B/S5946B, also known as the condo bill, would allow municipalities to value newly constructed and converted cooperative and condominium units as they would other real property to alleviate any negative tax impacts placed on the locality by the current statute. This bill passed both chambers in the recent legislative session and is awaiting delivery to the governor before December 31, 2022.

There have been a number of inquiries about the temporary restraining order against implementation of the state's final wind and solar appraisal model, which a New York State Supreme Court Justice issued back in April. The restraining order for the solar model is still in place. We are monitoring the progress of the lawsuit and will notify the membership of any developments.

We hope to have more information on the condo bill and the solar restraining order at the Fall Conference, September 18-21, 2022, at the Ft. William Henry Hotel in Lake George. If you are planning on attending and haven't registered, please do so today at nyassessor.org.



FALL CONFERENCE

NYSAA's Annual Meeting and Fall Conference on Assessment Administration will be held September 18—22, 2022 at the Ft. William Henry Hotel and Conference Center in Lake George, NY. As of this writing, there are 168 people registered to attend in person and 17 registered to attend online. The hotel's 193 rooms are filling quickly—if you are planning on attending the Fall Conference, please make your hotel reservation soon.

Here's almost everything you need to know about attending in person:

How to register for the Fall Conference: Go to nyassessor.org and click on the Find Out More! button on the home page. This takes you to the Fall Conference registration website, which includes class descriptions, a daily schedule, hotel information, and more. Make sure to look at all of the pages—many of your questions will be answered there. In-person attendance registration deadline is September 1; online attendance registration deadline is September 9.

How to make hotel reservations: See above for accessing the conference registration website. Go to the Hotel page and carefully read the information. Do not call the hotel to make a reservation. They will tell you the hotel is full. You can only make a reservation in the NYSAA room block and at the special NYSAA room fee by using the Hotel Reservation Form. The deadline to reserve a room at the NYSAA rate is August 25.

The hotel room prices on the Hotel Registration Form are per person and include all meals. The hotel is selling room/meal packages only. If you are bringing a spouse, partner, guest, etc. who may wish to attend only a few meals, make your reservation under "Single." Then, purchase individual meals at nyassessor.org/pay-online before September 2, 2022.

At the conference, you WILL NOT be able to purchase meals.

Boat Tour: Everyone who registered for the conference automatically will receive a ticket for the boat tour on Monday, September 19, 3:00—5:00 p.m. The dock is a short walk from the hotel. John H. Way – John M. Costello Memorial Educational Fund Cornell Seminar, Annual Conference, and IAO Scholarships Rules and Procedures

The John H. Way - John M. Costello Memorial Educational Fund (The Fund) shares the Institute of Assessing Officers' (IAO) objective in the education of assessing officials, government officers, and employees of the State of New York engaged in technical or legal functions related to the valuation of real property and the IAO's wish to promote professional development by providing educational programs.

In keeping with this objective, The Fund has instituted a program for the awarding of scholarships to help defray the cost of attending the Cornell Seminar and the Annual Conference.

All **Regular Members** in good standing with the NYSAA, including assessors and staff, are eligible to enter the scholarship lottery. **Staff must be Regular Members to enter.**

The scholarships are awarded annually for the next year's training by lottery drawing at the NYSAA Annual Conference.

During the annual lottery, the following number of scholarships and alternates will be chosen:

Cornell Seminar: Twelve (12) primary scholarship winners and six (6) alternates.

Annual Conference: Four (4) primary scholarship winners and two (2) alternates.

IAO Scholarship: IAO Course 1 and IAO Exam (both taken at Cornell Seminar): Two (2) primary scholarship winners and two (2) alternates.

In the event a primary scholarship winner is unable to attend the training seminar, an alternate will be contacted to back fill the vacant scholarship slot. Alternates will be contacted in the order in which they were drawn during the lottery. If a scholarship slot is still vacant after all alternate winners have been exhausted, that scholarship slot shall remain vacant for that year.

Scholarships must be used for the dates of training specified at the time of the award. If the scholarship is not used, the scholarship is forfeited.

All entry forms are to be submitted to The Fund chairperson, or their designee, or at the Annual Conference, and may be submitted up to the time of the drawing. The date and time of the drawing will be advertised at the Annual Conference and in the NYSAA Bulletin.

A single individual may only take advantage of a scholarship award once in a three-year period (i.e., an award recipient using a scholarship in 2021 would next be eligible for the 2024 seminar).

Scholarships will fund all real and necessary expenses which are paid or would be paid by the scholarship winner and are directly associated with the training seminar.

Direct expenses include the following:

Tuition and required textbook(s) for the seminar.

Hotel Lodging – NYSAA will provide a list of the scholarship winners to the seminar hotel (i.e., the Cornell Seminar or Annual Conference hotel) and the hotel will reserve the rooms. It is the responsibility of a scholarship winner to contact the hotel to confirm their reservation and arrival details. Hotel lodging costs will only be covered for the designated Cornell Seminar or Annual Conference hotel. If the scholarship winner chooses to stay at a different hotel, the lodging cost will not be covered. (Note: meals are included in the package price for the Annual Conference.)

Cornell Seminar Meals:

A meal allowance will not exceed \$50.00 per day for three meals (breakfast, lunch, and dinner).

Commuters (winners not staying at the hotel) will be reimbursed a meal allowance not to exceed the NYSAA established commuter meal rates per day for up to three meals (breakfast, lunch, and dinner) per day.

Special Note: If an event-sponsored meal is provided during the seminar, and the meal is offered at no additional cost to the scholarship winner, The Fund will NOT reimburse for that meal (i.e., the Cornell Seminar Sunday dinner).

Mileage if the scholarship winner's personal vehicle is used.

Tolls and parking expenses.

NOTE: Expenses for IAO Scholarship recipients are reimbursed the same as those for Cornell Seminar scholarship recipients except that the IAO Exam cost is also reimbursed.

To receive expense reimbursement, the scholarship recipient must submit a signed Travel and Expense Report, and all original receipts, to The Fund chairperson.

Any expenses that will be or are reimbursed to the scholarship winner by their municipality or company will not be reimbursed by The Fund.

The scholarship funds will not reimburse any lost wages during any training seminar.

Scholarship recipients must attend the entire seminar to receive payment of scholarship funds. If a scholarship winner must leave the seminar early, they may submit a written explanation of the circumstances of their departure to The Fund chairperson for consideration by The Fund Trustees. Any consideration of partial payment will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

Proposed NYSAA Constitution and Bylaws Amendments

Below are the NYSAA Constitution and Bylaws amendment recommendations as approved by the Executive Board on July 16, 2022. They will be voted on at the next meeting of the members at the Annual Meeting on Monday, September 19, 2022, 8:00 a.m., at the Ft. William Henry Hotel and Conference Center in Lake George, NY. Proposed deletions are struck out and proposed additions are in red.

Article I – NAME AND OBJECTIVES MISSION.

Article II – MEMBERSHIP

- (B) Associate Members Any individual other than a Regular member with an interest in supporting the avowed purpose mission and successful operation of the Association.
- (E) Affiliate Members Any individual other than a Regular member with an interest in supporting the avowed purpose mission and successful operation of the Association.

Section 2.

Add the following language ... to give strict adherence to the Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice of the Association;

Section 3. Suspension or Termination

B. Any member delinquent in the payment of dues for a period of six five months shall be suspended from membership.

Article IV – EXECUTIVE BOARD – Section 1. Governing Body

The governing body of the Association shall be the Executive Board which shall have the power to pass any resolution it may deem necessary to accomplish the purposes mission of the Association...
