#### COURSE CONTENT

This course is an introduction to art as a field of cultural production from prehistoric to contemporary art. This course seeks to address how visual art communicates meaning, how it is made, and why it was made during various time periods by various peoples. Through looking, reading and discussion, students will be introduced to the language, materials, methods, critical terms and historic significance of art.

#### COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of Art 200, students should be able to:

- Analyze images and art works through the appropriate context, and where applicable, the elements and principles of design.
- Explain how a work of art expresses, reflects and/or affects the social, political and aesthetic views of a culture in both historical and contemporary times.
- Distinguish the qualities and differences of fine art, commercial art and craft.

### **REQUIREMENTS**

### 1. Texts

- Various texts to be handed out

### 2. Participation

All students are expected to do the weekly readings and participate regularly and rigorously in classroom discussions.

- For each oral response given I will award you one participation point (maximum 15 points for the semester)
- Students will be split into teams for class activities to earn team points. The team with the most activity points will earn a huge reward at the end of the semester.

#### 3. Attendance

- If you are absent more than four times during the semester your final course grade will be lowered by one letter grade for each additional absence beyond the four that you incur.
- If you miss a lecture, you will be responsible to turn in summaries of readings that were
  discussed on the day of your absence. Failure to submit summaries within two weeks of
  your absence will result in the deduction of 1 point from your total participation points
  (maximum 15 points possible). No late summaries excepted. Once participation points
  are deducted, they cannot be reinstated.
- In extreme cases such as severe illness or injury, please contact me as soon as possible to avoid absence policy violations.

#### 4. Quizzes

- Short quizzes (worth 5 points each) will be given biweekly to keep you on your toes.
- Quizzes are also study guides for the final exam.
- I do not give make-up guizzes-missed guizzes will be given a zero.
- Only six of the eight quizzes will be recorded; the lowest scores will be thrown out.

# 5. Journal: an Intimate Record of the Course (15 entries total)

### Content:

- You will be asked to keep a journal throughout the semester to keep an intimate documentation of your ideas, thoughts, projects, visual imagery that this class had provoked in your mind.
- Each journal entry should be a response to course content each week.
- I may assign short writing assignments for your journal in class to help you work through some of the core concepts presented in lectures.

#### Format:

- You may use a standard notebook as your journal, but you are free to try different formats (i.e. audio, video, vlog, etc.) Notes you take in class do not count as a journal entry.
- The journal will be an accumulated product of your thoughts and analysis of topics we cover in class. Generally entries more than a page or audio/video media at least 10 minutes in length are the minimum.

# Grading:

- Journals will be reviewed mid-semester and at the end of the semester.
- Expected minimum for the content of the journals will be the core concepts to be covered in each class.

## 6. Paper

A critical essay of approximately 1000 words will be due at the end of the semester. The essay will either examine and analyze a work of art or compare and contrast various art forms and movements. I will go over the details mid-semester.

# 7. Final Exam:

FINAL EXAM DATE: December 18, Wednesday, 4:30-6:30pm

The final exam will be cumulative. If you take all the quizzes and use them as study guides, you will do well on the objective portion of the exam.

The final exam must be taken at the appointed time during finals week.

# 8. Assignments:

A variety of short assignments will be assigned to keep you engaged in the class.
