

WEDDING GUEST ETIQUETTE

The Bridal suite should be OFF-LIMITS!!!

Sometimes uninvited visitors can put unnecessary, extra stress on the bride before the day even gets started.

Send in your RSVP & do so by Snail-Mail (if that is what is requested)

The bride & groom spend a lot of time & money on the rsvp's & on planning their perfect day. So a head count is crucial

Refrain sending a Message or Text - take the same amount of time to reply to the card & pop it in the mailbox.

Drink Responsibly!!

Weddings are a time to party & celebrate the newlyweds..... BUT keep the drinking under control. You don't want to be remembered as the 'Drunk Guy' or "Drunk Girl" at their wedding.

DO NOT WEAR WHITE! (Definitely do not dress to compete or take the show from the Couple)

There's a time and place to 'take the show' but not as a guest at a wedding. The white outfit, a little too risqué or a revealing outfit... who maybe you, but it should be toned down in respect for the couple & THEIR DAY!

Speeches should be short, sentimental, sweet & funny

Limit to 3-4 minutes MAX!

Get out of your chair!

The couple will love the participation if you have fun on the dance floor. Have fun, they will only get married once

Mail your Gift.

Unplug During the Ceremony!! Put the phone away & on SILENT!!

You were invited to share their day with them. IF your phone & others not there are more important.... You are at the wrong place.

Ask before you bring a Plus 1

Your invite didn't say plus 1, OR you didn't add your plus 1 to the RSVP:

Due to seating, food & respect, before you bring a Plus 1 if not invited, ASK ! The couples wedding Plans depend on RSVP's & no surprises.

Arrive on time

Arrive earlier than expected. Better to be early than late. Plus the bride doesn't want to be seeing guests arriving as she's lining up for the ceremony. Don't be rude.

Be punctual & respectful, arrive 10-15 minutes before the ceremonial time.
