- Remain outside the field of play and within the Designated Spectators' Area
- Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do
- Recognize that coaches and Board members are volunteers, giving of personal time and money to provide a recreational activity for your child
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials
- Avoid criticizing a player, coach or referee for making a mistake mistakes are part of learning
- Accept the results of each game. Encourage your child to be gracious in victory, and to turn defeat into victory by working towards improvement
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting, or abusive language or behavior

<u>I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by MSA. I may be:</u>

- Issued a verbal warning from a referee or MSA official
- Obliged to leave the game fields
- Cause forfeiture of game(s)
- Required to meet with an MSA board member
- Required to appear before the MSA Appeals and Discipline committee
- Obliged to undertake an education course
- Required to complete volunteer hours with MSA
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents
