■ Wildflower Music Park – Myths vs. Facts ■

Myth: ■ Traffic will be minimal.

Fact: CR-219A & SR-26 already crash-prone; FDOT data shows fatalities. An independent traffic & evacuation study is required.

Myth: ■ Noise will be controlled with orientation & buffers.

Fact: Low-frequency bass travels miles. No independent noise study filed. ULDC requires real monitoring and enforceable limits.

Myth: ■ Agritourism laws allow festivals here.
