

# RUTLAND PARENT CARER VOICE AUTUMN NEWSLETTER 2024

Hello to you all, especially to our recently joined members, a warm welcome to our Autumn Newsletter.

We hope you are enjoying your half-term holidays, it seems to have been a very long first term.

We wanted to update you on a few work streams, and what's been happening generally within the world of SEND in Rutland and across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland Health Trusts.

#### RESOURCES INTO SCHOOLS

The Forum have supplied a resource box to Schools on 2<sup>nd</sup> October, 2024, at a joint Education, Health event, and most School Sencos were in attendance. This has not been done before, and a full range of professionals were there for Schools to engage with, including Teen Health, CAMHS, and a range of therapists. This was a chance for Schools to mix with the Health professionals, whilst having a Training Workshop.

The boxes were for all Primary Schools and the three Secondary, with the aim of helping towards more inclusivity within them. Some Schools that have Specialist units had more than one resource pack. The contents of the boxes have items in them that Schools may not have been aware of. The equipment has been chosen by specialist professionals, and training on how to use each piece was demonstrated at the event. A couple of schools were unable to attend, or had no room for the large boxes within their car, and the final few have been delivered by us.

Examples within the box included Floor desk, wobble cushion, body sock, writing supports including slope, overlays and grips. There are also items for mood/anxiety including mood bands, weighted shoulder strap and chair bands. We have had some lovely responses to the boxes, and hope that the equipment will be well used by the children that need some additional help.

The schools can then use the equipment, and then make informed decisions about purchasing any multiple resources.

#### **Eligibility Criteria:**

- COVID-19 vaccinations are being offered to anyone aged 5+ at Emmanuel Church Hall, who is eligible for a COVID-19 vaccination (eligible under 5s will be invited to specialist vaccination clinics at the Leicester Royal Infirmary)
- Flu vaccinations are also available at the Emmanuel Church Hall for anyone aged 18+ who is eligible for a flu vaccination.
- · Family members & carers may be able to get their vaccinations too (subject to COVID-19 and flu vaccination eligibility criteria).

#### **Booking:**

Patients will be contacted and booked into the Emmanuel Church Hall clinic. Patients can proactively call: 0116 497 5700 option 1. Specialist adjustments according to need will be noted and accommodated where practically possible. Each appointment will be 20mins in duration (unless determined otherwise). LPT specialist LD nurses will be present to providesupport. A drive-through vaccination option is available for those that prefer to be vaccinated in their own vehicle.

# Support for parent/carers Email response service for parent carers with young people who may have Autism – no diagnosis needed.

Autism Central's Midlands Autism Hub have an email response service to support parents and carers of autistic people around the key questions or challenges they are facing.

When using this free service, parents and carers will be emailed by one of the Peer Educators with lived experience of autism with an email response surrounding their key questions or challenges and be signposted to local and national organisations that may be able to help.

This service is for parents, carers, or those who care for autistic people (no diagnosis required) living in the Midlands.

We've already had many families access this free service seeking information and signposting around understanding distressed behaviour, barriers to learning, autistic burnout, supporting sleep, understanding mental wellbeing and more.

We are also commencing a new service. Over the next few months we have been invited schools to help bridge the gap and aid communication between schools and parents. Individual schools will be contacting parents. We hope to meet some of you there.

#### WORKSTREAMS

We continue to be involved in aspects of the CPP Change Programme, testing new reforms which may or may not be implemented nationally. Most streams are underway, and we are working collaboratively with Leicester City and Shire Forums , and across all partners including Health , Social Care, Sendias and the Voluntary Sector. Results will be analysed and fed up to Dept. of Education. The LAW has not changed, but anything that can help speed up the system, reduce waiting lists can only be helpful. The systems are still in the testing phase.

The systems must be needs led and not diagnosis led, so that children and young people get the support they need at the right time, and not sitting in huge waiting lists without the necessary support.

We have also been involved in looking at the existing Policies within Transport, we have not had sight of any proposed changes, if, and when we do everyone will know, and nothing can be

changed without a Consultation process. We continue to be part of discussions from Early years right through to Preparing for Adulthood, Looking at Schools being more welcoming and accepting of all differences, including additional needs. Health, Social Care and Education need to work more closely together to maximise every child's potential.

# Support for Young Carers

Rutland County Council provide 3 groups to support Young Carers in Rutland. The groups are: Little Stars (ages 5-7)

Young Stars (ages 8-12)

Time out for Us (ages 11-19)

These groups support siblings of children who have SEND, those caring for an adult family member and also children of foster carers.

The groups meet monthly and always include an activity of the group's choice. They provide the opportunity for young carers to share experiences and support each other as well as simply having their own time.

Recently, a group of 11 Young Carers took part in a residential trip to PGL at Caythorpe Manor in Grantham. The group spent time doing a host of adventure activities and enjoying some much deserved time away from their responsibilities.
