Concerns are growing about proposed government changes to SEND support – including suggestions to reduce the number of children with EHC plans in mainstream schools.

We've been following comments from MP Alicia Kearns, who has voiced her opposition to the reforms. She continues to challenge proposals that may put legal rights and much-needed support at risk.
