FUNCTIONAL BEHAVIOR ASSESSMENT & BEHAVIOR INTERVENTION PLANS BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

A Functional Behavior Assessment (FBA) is a **collaborative process** for collecting information that can help determine the **function** of a particular misbehavior. The purpose of an FBA is to inform the creation of a Behavior Intervention Plan (BIP) that will work to **shape the behavior** to a more appropriate behavior.

When is an FBA needed?

An FBA is an appropriate process for any student who is exhibiting a misbehavior for which the function is unclear and for whom previous attempts at interventions have been unsuccessful.

Who conducts an FBA?

An FBA involves a team of people including, but not limited to, the student, the parent/ guardian, teachers, service providers, and a team leader. The team must include the school psychologist or pupil adjustment counselor.

How long does an FBA take?

How long does an FBA take? The FBA process includes interviews, observations and team meetings. Data collection may take place for 1-2 weeks. The BIP is implemented for a minimum of 6-weeks with regular check-in meetings to ensure fidelity and effectiveness.










How do I request an FBA?

If you are concerned about a student's behavior and previous interventions have not been effective, you may request an FBA through your school's Student Support Team. FBA's require parent/guardian consent before the process may begin.

THE FBA PROCESS



FBAs are not a Special Education Intervention. Most FBAs are conducted for general educa4on students FBAs are also required for Special Education students who are facing a change of placement or disciplinary transfer FBAs focus on one behavior at a time, even if the student has multiple misbehaviors.
