

# 2026

## June

The first week of June saw the second major of the year, the SGA Seve. With a real mixture of weather conditions, ranging from strong blustery winds, heavy rain and sunny conditions, the competition was won, on countback, by Eamonn Mizele. Eamonn, David Marshall who was runner-up and Steve Cave, last year's winner, all finished on one under par. Congratulations to all 25 members who took part in difficult conditions.

The second week of June saw the SGA Foursomes, and, despite a very nasty weather forecast, we managed to escape with just one small shower. The competition was won by Peter Cottiss and John Daniels, with an excellent score of 39 points. Three points behind were Trevor Hale and Harry Jackson, with John Hughes and Tony Hollister finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> with 34 points. Well done to everyone who saw the competition out, especially Alan Tugwell, who stayed on to mark his opponent's card.

Week three of a very busy June saw glorious weather for the June Stableford competition, and, as a result we had another bumper turnout. The competition was won by Igor Gardner with 39 points, or three under par. A single point behind was Sean Hartley and a further point behind was Sue Owen, so the first three home all finished under par.

June ended with the Memorial Trophy, a pairs fourball competition in memory of all those members and friends who are no longer with us. The day saw the beginnings of a heatwave, with soaring temperatures and glorious sunshine. With the course in immaculate condition, especially the greens, the scoring was unusually high. The winners, with 45 points, were Chris Weetman and Tony Hollister, followed just one point behind by David Marshall and Kevin Gornell. Third on 42 points were John Hughes and Jack Geldart. The day was a fitting tribute to our missing colleagues.

## **May**

**May begun with a very windswept stableford competition which was won with an exceptional 43 points, or seven under par, by new member Kevin Gornell. Runner-up was Trevor Hale on 36 points, with Alan Tugwell in third on 35 points, beating Val Peel on countback.**

**The second competition in May was the “Unleash Your Drive” stableford competition, in aid of the Golf Foundation. This was not an Order of Merit competition and £5 from every entry fee went to the Golf Foundation. The event was won by Simon Shrouder, with another handicap busting score of 43 points. Runner-up was Bill Dobson, with Steve Cave in third place, both 36 points. Well done to everyone who supported this competition for the foundation.**

## **April**

**April saw the start of the Summer Order of Merit, with the added incentive of qualification to the Club Championship and Victor Ludorum competitions at the end of the season. The opening stableford competition was won on countback by Barry Hand, from Miles Lilley, with both players accumulating a staggering 41 points. Third place, just one point behind was Peter Cottiss. Once again we saw an impressive turnout of 26 players to start the summer.**

The competition was won by Pat Keaveney, with a very impressive nett score of 51, four under par, runner-up, with a score of 53, was Tom Weston, who also had the lowest gross score, with Bob Kirk finishing third on 54. ## **March**

**The first week of March saw the penultimate Winter League competition, the March strokeplay. It was won with a sensational five under par score of 22 by Igor Gardner, four shots clear of Sue Owen, with John Hughes a further shot back in third.**

With each player having one win it went down to second places, resulting in Tony Hollister finishing second. Igor Gardner finished third with Malcolm Russell finishing fourth.
