There were various reasons why people chose not to participate. The pandemic meant that many of the Mount Allison students and others were not physically on campus or in Sackville and did their studies or worked, remotely. Some chose not to curl for either their own health reasons or in protection of elderly relatives and in keeping contacts to a minimum.

At the start of January, 2021 the province went into a RED lockdown and the Curling Club prepared for and was ready to offer curling when ZONE 1 returned to the ORANGE and then YELLOW phases. Regarding league play, forty-four individuals took part in the ORANGE and 75 curled in the YELLOW phase to the end of the season. The Club also remained open at certain other times to allow for practice and drop in opportunities and for rentals.

Thank you to all members who supported the club both physically and financially and we will all look forward to increased participation in the 2021-22 season.
