Dear Fellow Fishing Club Members,

Spring is in the air and fishing has been great at Innsbrook. Almost all the lakes are near perfect temperature, 62 to 70 degrees. I have had numerous reports of several big bass being caught. In addition, several people have reported unbelievable numbers of bass being caught in just a few hours of fishing. The bass are very active as they are beginning to spawn or on their nests. Crappie, bluegill and red ear sunfish are being caught in numerous lakes. Please remember to remove those Green Sunfish!!

Fish Habitat Improvement Work Days

Thank you to everyone who came out, not just once but several times, to help with creating and placing fish habitat improvements. As a first-time initiative at IBK, we had over 50 people volunteer over 5 days which equates to over 400 hours of donated time. Natural and artificial habitats were placed in Lake Alpine, Lake Aspen, Aspenetter and Lake Lucern. We used approximately 200 concrete blocks, cut hundreds of cedar trees, wrapped thousands of feet of wire, poured hundreds of pounds of concrete, used about 300 feet of 4 inch pipe and a few thousand feet of sprinkler pipe. Thank you and congratulations to everyone who volunteered.

I have personally fished the new habitat and it is amazing the number of fish holding in these new structures. Everyone, including the fish, likes new homes!! You should be able to find most of these structures on your fish finder. However, I am working on getting GPS coordinates for most of the structures placed so everyone has access to these new hot spots. Please be patient, information is coming soon.

Paddlefish Harvest

In late January, Osage Catfisheries were on Lake Alpine and removed 58 paddlefish. It was an interesting couple of days watching how they netted, determined if a fish was male or female (for the roe), and then sorted for processing. These fish averaged 35 pounds for males and 51 pounds for females. While they hoped for more fish to be caught, it is a start to reducing this biomass source in the lake. It will be interesting to see what, if any, effect this removal will have on the overall fish population.

Missouri Department of Conservation – Electroshock Fish Survey

Mark your calendars, call in sick to work and come watch the electroshock survey on Lakes Lucern and Alpine. These are scheduled for Friday, May 12, during the day on Lake Lucern and on Monday, May 15, at night on Lake Alpine. Due to the clarity of the water on Alpine, the MDC has recommended a night survey to have better survey results. Unfortunately, the MDC will not allow us in the boat due to liability issues. However, they will allow spectators!!

Lake Lucern was chosen since the MDC said it is easier to make changes quicker on a smaller lake (30 acres) than a large lake (236 acres in Alpine). Please remember “quicker” in the fisheries management arena means 2 to 3 years. I believe if we actively manage Lucern based upon the data from the survey, we can demonstrate how to improve fishing quality. It is our test case of a reasonably sized lake.
