

The general standard for scoring the actions in a MuayThai match is to evaluate the quantity and quality of Scoring Strikes Landed, Effective Aggression and Ring Generalship (Control of the Actions).

Officials are required to score each round with such criteria and to determine the winner of the round in numeric fashion.

A competent judge should look for damage, domination and disruption while evaluating effective aggression, ring generalship and defense

Following you will find the clear description of the criteria for each category for the margin of victory in a round when no knockdowns occur.

It is important to remember that the close, moderate, decisive and extreme decisive system is only for judges to get a clearer understanding in their mental computer of the differentiation of scoring a round.

CLOSE (10-9)

When one fighter has won the round by a narrow margin of victory over their opponent. When comparing scoring strikes a couple effective strikes scored could swing the round in either direction.

MODERATE (10-9)



When one fighter has won the round by a clear margin of victory over their opponent. When comparing Scoring strikes the winner of the round was ahead by more than a couple effective strikes scored and winner of the round could not have changed without a significant impact.

DECISIVE (10-9)

When one fighter has won the round by a large margin of victory over their opponent. When comparing Scoring strikes the winner of the round has convincingly won the round.

EXTREME DECISIVE (10-8)

When one fighter has won the round by total domination and significantly outscored their opponent. The winning fighter dominated and staggered the other fighter in extreme fashion without a knockdown in the round.
