








Part 1 Process & Project Overview



Watershed Protection and Flood Prevention Program (PL-566)

Managed and funded by NRCS

To qualify, irrigation districts must have 1) match funding 2) authorized Final Plan-EA or Plan-EIS



General PL-566 Requirements

- Must have a project **sponsor**
- Project must fit an **authorized use**
- Must have agricultural or rural community benefits
- Congressional approval for projects over \$25 million




Additional Requirements

- Watershed Plans must comply with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and
- **Program requirements**, including an economic analysis



Watershed Planning Process




What a Plan-EIS Includes

- Economic Analysis




Modernization Alternative 1: Piping



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
Modernization Alternative 2: Canal Lining
