



WFA AWARDS: AMADOR COUNTY FAIR DIVISION 28 - INTERIM EVENTS

The Fairgrounds host an annual event called Farm Days, put on by the local UC Extension-4H, FFA, Grange and Cattlewomen's Association. This event is set up in stations around the fairgrounds on how food is grown, animals, what products come from those animals, what equipment is used that we use in everyday life. This is done for all 3rd graders in Amador County. This year due to Covid, the event was not able to be held.

The Cattlewomen got together with the UC Cooperative Extension and created an 8 min and 37 second video of the typing Farm Day presentation titled "Cattle & the Products they product". The called a local 4-H member and his show heifer, the Youth Beef Ambassador and the Cattlewomen to start filing. This took a bit over 3 hours and was then edited down to the one you can see on You Tube. This video has been viewed 75 times by our local schools with an average of 2625 students seeing it.

With it being shared on social media, the audience is huge and will benefit many young people in learning about their food and how it is raised and used. This was the new-virtual Farm Day for 2021 done by the AES Cattlewomen!
