


MEMBERS MATTER 2025 Seniors

GRANGER RUNS FOR TRIBAL COUNCIL

Timothy Keeton of South Coffeyville Grange #351 runs for Tribal Council. The following is part of an interview that was published in the Cherokee Pheonix newspaper on April 1, 2025.

Why did you choose to run for Tribal Council? I chose to run for Tribal Council because of my deep commitment to both my family and the broader community. My primary motivation is to contribute to the advancement of the Cherokee people, ensuring that our rich heritage and culture continue to thrive for future generations. By serving on the Tribal Council, I aim to influence policy in a way that promotes transparency and bridges gaps between the tribal government and Cherokee citizens. This role provides an opportunity to address the needs and concerns of our community, fostering a more inclusive and supportive environment for all members.

What do you believe the greatest needs are within the district you are candidate for and how will you address those needs? As a Tribal Council member candidate, I believe the greatest needs within District 11 are transparency of revenue sources and where those funds have been spent. To address these needs, I will advocate clear and open financial reporting to ensure that resources are directed towards initiatives that genuinely benefit district 11. Additionally, I will work with members to identify pressing local issues and develop tailored programs that effectively address these concerns. By fostering transparency and community involvement, we can create a fairer and more supportive environment for all

members of our district.

What services will you work to expand and/or create for citizens within your district? I deeply care about making healthcare and essential services more accessible for everyone in District 11, especially in our rural areas. I will work to improve our urgent care facilities, so everyone gets the quality of care they need. As someone who grew up here, I understand the importance of developing our towns and rural area infrastructure to improve our daily lives. I'll also focus on setting up a TAG office to make vehicle registration easier. Providing more fair housing options is crucial, and I am committed to ensuring everyone has a safe and affordable place to call home. Creating jobs through local partnerships will be a priority to strengthen our community's economy.

How do you plan to protect and promote the Cherokee language and culture as a councilor? As a Councilor, I plan to protect and promote the Cherokee language and culture by: Implementing programs that provide incentives for native speakers to teach and share the language with others, ensuring its preservation and growth. Encourage the use of the Cherokee language in community events and educational programs to enhance visibility and engagement. I have plans to work on adding Cherokee names to street signs and other public signage throughout District 11, making the language a visible and integral part of the community landscape. Developing programs in community centers and schools focused on teaching the Cherokee language and culture, including workshops, classes, and cultural events to foster appreciation and understanding among all ages.

THE DICTIONARY PROJECT

The Grange is proud to support The Dictionary Project through its Word for Thirds program. Through the tireless efforts of the Grange's network of more than 200,000 volunteers, America's oldest rural and agriculture organization has presented third-grade students across the nation with more than 500,000 dictionaries. their communities with dictionaries. The Dictionary Project program packets are available to help Granges institute this program in their communities. The packets includes: an instruction and presentation guide, a sample letter to send to schools, a dictionary project overview and order form, a label template, a participation form, sample press release, and sample media advisory.
