

LET'S GO BLU

- Warners Bros., which effectively ended the format war when it announced sole support for Blu-ray, is letting customers swap their HD DVD titles for the Blu-ray version in its new Red2Blu program. The "upgrade," available through Red2Blu.com, costs \$4.95 per title.
- The two-disc set of Frank Miller's *The Spirit* provides more than the usual Blu-ray digital goodies. Viewers can log into the film's MoLog (movie blog), hack up the storyboard and insert their own directives (audio, text, graphics). Share your talent with other MoLoggers.
- Free Blu-ray rentals? More public libraries are offering them free of charge. The Washington Centreville Public Library in Ohio, for example, offers more than 1,000 HD titles, which can be borrowed two at a time.
- The average price of Blu-ray players dropped nearly 34 percent in the last year, falling from \$393 in the first quarter of 2008 to \$261 in the first quarter of 2009, according to the research firm NPD.
