Palmyra Township Regular Board Meeting Minutes March 11, 2025

Meeting called to order at 7:03 p.m. by Supervisor Dave Pixley at the Palmyra Township Hall, 6490 Palmyra Rd.

Supervisor Pixley opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment:

- Ryan Powell, 4423 Rau Hwy, thanked the Board for aligning with the community in regards to supporting the Solar Energy Systems Ordinance. He also stated that the Board needs to put the Township in line with the other townships in joining the Foster Swift litigation, and that he and his wife Morgan would pay the \$5,000 for the Township to join. Ryan then presented to the Board a proposal of a Community Task Force to address key infrastructure and community challenges in Palmyra Township. One of the topics Ryan brought up was green energy in the form of community solar.
- Jeff Ehlert, Blissfield, stated that the Board has pushed solar out and left it up to the Michigan Public Service Commission, thereby, forgoing the financial benefits. He also said that community solar would cost the Township millions of dollars.
- Justin Brown, 5778 Carleton Rd, stated that community solar is a great idea. He said that the project would put money back in the pockets of residents, and that the project would grow as the community grows.
- Blake Brosamer, 5950 Rau Hwy., thanked the Board for supporting the Solar Energy Systems Ordinance. He reported that surveyors are in his area and asked if they are supposed to be there. He said that the surveyors are in unmarked vehicles with out of state license plates, and they are making some of the neighbors nervous. Supervisor Pixley replied that the surveyors are marking underground utilities.

She said that Lisa stated that if the Township were to prepare a 5-year park and rec plan that's approved by the DNR, it would make the Township eligible for a lager pot of money under the trust fund program, up to \$350k.

- Jason Morrison, Lenawee County Drain Commission Superintendent of the water and sewer systems of Lenawee County: Jason reported that EGLE is encouraging municipalities to tie into a municipal water system that will replace the smaller systems, such as the well house in Manor Farms. Jason stated that the well house will be increasingly difficult to maintain due to issues with testing the closed system. Supervisor Pixley stated that Madison Township has tentatively approved hookup to their water system, but this would be costly. Jason said that representatives from Great Lakes Community Action Partnership (GLCAP) will be attending the April 8, 2025, regular meeting to present to the Board a grant program that can help with the cost of a new water system.

 Program Managers from DTE, to discuss DTE's purchase of the Beecher Solar Project.
