# Palmyra Township Regular Board Meeting Minutes February 11, 2025

Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Supervisor Dave Pixley at the Palmyra Township Hall, 6490 Palmyra Rd.

Supervisor Pixley opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion Crane, support Koester to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried

### **Public Comment:**

- Debra Rogers of Palmyra Township, Schultz-Holmes District Library Trustee, stated that she will give periodic updates to the Township Board regarding the Schults-Holmes District Library. She reminded the Board that a 1.25 millage was passed by voters in the August 2024 Primary Election. With that said, the 2025 adopted budget states a projected income of \$488,000. She also shared that since the library has become a district library, it no longer receives Blissfield Village appropriations of \$248,000. With that said, Debra reported that 52.06% of the library's operating budget is dedicated to wages. She pointed out that all library employees received a raise after the millage was passed. As a Trustee, she wants the library to be fiscally responsible.
- Lee Andre from Raisin Township stated that the seven solar arrays in Raisin Township were built through the cooperation of land owners, residents and the solar companies. He encourages the Board to have thoughtful ordinances.
- Ryan Powell, Rau Hwy, stated that he is concerned and does not understand why the solar companies ESA and RWE are in the Township since the community voted on an ordinance that keeps large solar arrays out of the Township. Ryan stated that he feels it's the Board's responsibility to uphold the community., and asks why the Board continues to court the solar companies. He also stated that the draft renewable energy ordinances were approved by the Lenawee County Planning Commission, so the Board's vote on those proposed ordinances should be "yes" to uphold what the Palmyra Township citizens want.
- Tom Creque, 9555 Sylvania Ave., stated that he owns land in Palmyra Township and is speaking in favor of a workable solar ordinance. He also stated that the Township has been dealing with solar for approximately five years, and he would like to see some progress. He stated that within a five-year period, the solar companies have become

- financially vested by continuing to pay monthly lease payments to the landowners. He believes that solar is a good investment for the Township.
- Mark Farris, Monroe County, stated that nuclear energy is being resurrected in Michigan. He does not believe that solar is the correct choice, as it consumes large areas of farm ground. He also stated that solar companies do not always pay the taxes owed to the municipalities, and that their goal is pay as little as possible.
- Deb Comstock, 2525 Ogden Hwy., stated that she has lived in Palmyra Township since she was approximately four years old and remembers a very different community a collaborative community. She stated that currently farmers own most of the land in the Township and pay most of the taxes. Deb stated that the farmers are hurting financially due to the decreases in the market. She pointed out that solar would provide funds for services in the Township, and economic development would occur as well. Deb pointed out that when considering the ordinances, the Board has the opportunity and responsibility of considering the land owners as well as constituents.

He stated that since September 2024, the Collection O&M has decreased by \$40,000.

- Township Hall Generator Wall Repair: Supervisor Pixley reported that we are waiting for Adrian Electric & Generator to install the generator system. Dave also mentioned that he met with John Turpening, who works at Citizens Gas Fuel, and no updates need to be completed prior to the installation of the generator.
- Township Hall Lighting & Electrical Work: Supervisor Pixley reported that he will have quotes by the March 11 Regular Meeting for the upgrade to LED lights in the Hall.
- Boiler Pump Replacement: Supervisor Pixley reported that one of the older pumps on the boiler system went out, and he had to contact JC Mechanical to replace it. Supervisor Pixley stated that two old pumps remain, and could quit working at any given time. He also said that JC Mechanical had a difficult time locating a similar pump to replace the old pump. Trustee Mark Crane suggested that a pump be purchased and stored on a shelf in case one of the old pumps fails. Motion Crane, support Papenhagen to allow the Supervisor to purchase a new pump for the boiler system to have on hand in case one of the old pumps fails. Motion carried
