























Hebrew Letter Chart

The Hebrew language describes things in concrete not abstract terms, by their function not appearance. Hebrew started as a pictographic language with each symbol representing an actual physical thing which could also relate to its function. Most of the names of the letters are also Hebrew words with meanings that relate to the original pictograph. Each letter is also the symbol of a numerical value.
