In partnership with WeCan Ministries, a network of over a dozen recovery centers in Arkansas, our transformation home will house up to sixteen women who will enroll in a long-term two phase in-house residence program. This includes a black out period and a rigorous daily schedule where the women are expected to attend daily Bible study, worship, complete chores, projects and work. We will help women find a job and re-establish them back into the community.



OUR MISSION

MMOA is a faith based, Christ-centered recovery ministry for women. We strive to help women break the cycle of addiction through the love and gospel of Jesus Christ. We desire to see women who are addicted to drugs and/or alcohol become rehabilitated and live productive God honoring lives. We want women to know that recovery is possible through a personal growing relationship with Jesus Christ. Our treatment center will focus on recovery from a Christian perspective while simultaneously working with other groups and organizations to have a lasting impact on the women we serve and our community at large.







THE PROBLEM

The effects of drug and alcohol addiction in Western Arkansas is devastating.

Arkansas was recently ranked No. #1 in methamphetamine use by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services

Administration. Women are especially vulnerable to abuse drugs early in life.

National studies show that girls between the ages of 12-17 are more likely to misuse all types of prescription opioids and stimulants than boys. Women are also more likely to experience intense cravings and relapse, and women suffer more liver damage and overdoses than men.



In a nine-county area in Western Arkansas with a total population of 134,000 there are currently no existing recovery centers for women. In this same nine-county area, population has decreased over the last ten years while drug addiction has been on the rise.

Arkansas ranked No. #1 in methamphetamine use in the nation.
