Spring Has Finally Sprung!

The SCGC has been working hand in hand with the HOA to whip our common areas into shape following the back-to-back hard freezes that our area has suffered during the past couple of winters in time for our spring holidays. An evaluation was done to assess plant and infrastructure damages. The freeze and age did a number on our sprinkler systems in the common areas and our HOA oversaw the many needed repairs and expenses so that our new plantings would survive when the summer heat hits our area.

Fortunately, our SCGC had a rainy-day fund set aside for use in the case of incurred catastrophic damages. So once the HOA repaired the sprinkler systems, then the HOA and the SCGC were able to move forward jointly with the many needed plant replacements.

Thanks needs to go out to Ann Price and Bonnie Steidley, who worked with the HOA and oversaw the SCGC's contribution to this effort. This major effort was a two-year project which saw a financial outlay from SCGC of \$10,250 in 2022 (for cleaning up and refreshing after the freeze of \$4,500 and \$900 in the Fall at Broadmoor at Longview) and of \$8,520 in 2023 for Spring replanting and refreshing (which included cleaning beds, fertilizing, mulching and hauling trash away). Also, Annette Deitch did a wonderful job of overseeing the refreshing and the needed supplemental plantings in the Mother's Garden.

To maintain the enhanced landscaping the SCGC contributes \$600 annually to the HOA for a water allowance and to maintain the plantings SCGC contributes \$2,340 monthly.

Additionally, if you noticed the sprucing up to our main Sugar Creek entrance at Sugar Creek Blvd. and Country Club Blvd. several months ago; this was the result of a joint effort between a grant from the City of Sugar Land, the HOA and a contribution from our Garden Club. And as always please admire the large planter pots at the Main Guard House put together by Ann Wendell with Becky Joiner's assistance.

If you haven't had a chance to drive by the Mother's Garden and see how beautiful it is looking, you should take the opportunity to do so. In fact, drive around the neighborhood, we are still waiting for some of the larger plants that have been ordered to come in; but overall, the common areas in the neighborhood are really looking nice. Everything is in great shape for the arrival of our Spring Holidays! And we can be proud to call Sugar Creek our home.
