October is such a fun month! Ghosts, Ghouls and Gardening! Fall is officially here as of Saturday, September 23. Yellow mums, orange pumpkins and golden leaves abound. Those that didn't burn up, turn brown and give up that is! And no, that is not hay- just dead burnt up grass. This is Texas not Vermont after all.

It is time to plan and plant your fall garden if you haven't already. I am anxiously awaiting my flats of colorful annuals from the club's plant sale. If you participated in that sale, expect your flats to arrive on Monday, November 6. The ladies will call when your pick up is ready. If you enjoy planting and harvesting vegetables, we have included the vegetable planting calendar from the Harris Country Extension office for your perusal. 10-15 is the best time to plant Sweet Onions.

According to our beloved Randy Lemon, October 15 - November 15 is the time to fertilize your lawns in preparation for the cold winter and potential freeze that we expect in January and February. Remember the formula for fall is 8-12-16 and is available at your favorite nursery or garden center.

- This is the optimum month to plant bulbs (the ones that don't need to be refrigerated)
- Time to add pre-emergent herbicide for weed control to lawns

- Randy advised to stop feeding our plants and give them the chance to go dormant
- 2nd pruning season for roses, including Knock Outs.

Our October Bake Sale has moved to March due to focus on our Annual Live Auction and Dinner. Please look for notes from Shelley later in this newsletter with all the rockin' details. She has a really special event planned and I know you won't want to miss that! Don't be square- Mark your calendar for this event, Thursday November 9th at the club.
