Patti Felker wanted to bring to members attention that the Houston Botanic Garden is hosting Sean Kenney's newest LEGO exhibit "Nature Connects" through February 19, 2023 in the Susan Garver Family Discovery Garden. Kinney has collaborated with the LEGO Group as an official partner for 14 years. His work has been recognized by The New York Times, PBS Arts, BBC Arts, and Vogue. There are a total of 16 LEGO sculptures from the smallest mouse to the largest sculpture of a Monarch on

Milkweed. If you are looking for a way to bring out the wonders of nature and to highlight how pollination works in nature to your children or grandchildren this exhibit which wraps around the lagoon with plenty of space to wander is truly inspiring for young and old alike.
