The AzSCI is the statewide Science achievement test for Arizona students in Grades 5, 8 and 11 and is administered in three parts. All 8th grade students will take the AzSCI Test on March 26, and March 27.

 MARCH 27 Period 1 will last from 8:00-9:51, all other class periods will be shorter in the morning. Lunch times and afternoon classes will remain as normally scheduled.

AASA is the statewide achievement test for Arizona students in Grades 3-8. All Arizona public school students in Grades 3-8 will take the grade level AASA assessments in English Language Arts and Mathematics.

All 8th grade students will take the AASA Writing Test in their ELA

Classroom on April 8. All students will report to Period 2 as their first class. They will go in order of class periods, and end the day in Period 1.

- All 7th grade students will take the AASA Writing Test in their ELA Classroom on April 9. All students will take the AASA ELA Reading Test in their ELA Classroom on April 11 and April 12.
- All students will take the AASA Math Test in their Math Classroom on April 15 through April 18.
- The week of APRIL 15-18 students will test on two days with their math teacher. On Monday and Wednesday students will attend class periods 1,3, 5, 6, and 7. On Tuesday and Thursday students will attend periods 2, 4, 5, 6, and 8. Class times will be twice as long so that testing can be completed in the students math classroom with their math teacher.
