

It is important to keep your profile current with Home Office. If you have move, changed your e-mail address or phone number, please alert Home Office. This document will assist you in that process.

You can do this one of three ways:

- 2. Email Customer Service: CustomerService@GWRRA.org
- 3. Go online: http://www.gwrra.org/members

To update your information online:

If you have never logged on to this sight, you will first need to obtain log-in information. This can be done by clicking on the Welcome (Log-in) page where instructed.

After you complete this process you will receive an email with your user name and password.

After you have received your user name and password return to the Log-in page and on the left side of the screen click on "Manage My Records".

Click Continue. Enter your user Name and password.

Click Continue. At the Choose prompt, select the drop-down menu and choose "Modify My Record" and click on the "Go" button.

After you have made your changes click the Submit Changes button. This will update your information. When you have completed all the changes you need to make, be sure to log off.

If you have any questions, feel free to contact Customer Service at the phone number or email address listed above.

#### Updating Your Chapter Affiliation with Home Office

Your Chapter affiliation is automatically assigned using your zip code. You may find that the Chapter that feels most like "family" to you is not necessarily the Chapter to which you were automatically assigned. Many individuals don't bother to change their affiliation (also called an "override"), but there are some excellent reasons to change your affiliation to your Chapter of choice. For example, if your chosen Chapter is participating in the Chapter of the Year program, it can benefit them to have you on their Area Report List if you are an active Chapter participant. If you wish to serve your chapter in an Officer position, you will also want to change your Chapter affiliation.

What a great change in the weather... but don't be surprised if the temperature drops from one day to the next. We will be seeing this curve thru April and into early May. If you decide to take a ride or a ride with the Chapter, be prepared for the temperature changes even throughout the day. I remember a few years back where I didn't look at the weather report and it was in the 6o's in the morning with highs in the low 70's. There is still a need for **Chapter Skills Enhancement Advisors** (CSEA), a fancy name for that Member who loves encouraging safe riding, involvement in the Levels program, communicates training opportunities in the area or arranges for training when the Chapter wants it.

The District has two great District Educator Assistants. They fill a position responsible for rider safety in education. They give all the time they have to give and fulfil an important need. With 12 Chapters, adding a **District Educator** would allow us to reach more of you.

The **District University Coordinator** is an administrative position, concerned with communicating with the Instructor/Trainers, keeping them apprised of training opportunities and recertification dates.

For the Member who enjoys helping at Rally, there is a position known as the **Goodies Coordinator**. This Member or Members set up a table at Rally to sell the District's patches, pins, and gift items. Only friendly folks need apply.

**District Motorist Awareness Coordinator.** Come to Chapter Va-L's Motorist Awareness event on May 15<sup>th</sup> to see just what this program is about. There will be representatives from the National program helping us to teach the motoring community to look out for motorcycles.

There is plenty to volunteer for, we need all kinds of skills and will make sure we are staying within your time commitment.

Enjoy the holidays.







Distracted driving is a growing epidemic on our roadways, claiming thousands of lives and injuring hundreds of thousands each year in the United States. There were 847 traffic fatalities in Virginia in 2020\* compared to 827 traffic fatalities in 2019 and the number of traffic fatalities on Virginia roadways increased 18.3% between 2014 and 2019. The Governors Highway Safety Association says that phone use while driving is one of the most common driver distractions. (\*2020 data is preliminary and subject to change.)

#### **Top Tips For Avoiding Driver Distraction:**

- Put your phone down.
- Enable the "Do Not Disturb" feature on your phone.
- Install a "Do Not Disturb" app that detects when you are driving.
- Enter addresses into your GPS device before driving.
- Never reach for something that has fallen or slid away from you.
- · Avoid eating, drinking, smoking, and other distracting activities while driving.

#### Stayin' Safe: Fueling Risk

With multiple entrances and vehicles constantly flowing in and out, a busy gas station is one of the most foreboding intersections a rider will encounter.

Intersections are the most common sites of motorcycle crashes involving other vehicles. You probably knew that. Oncoming vehicles turning left across the path of the unsuspecting motorcyclist and drivers pulling into the rider's lane from a side street are serious risks to the street rider. The astute motorcyclist approaches intersections with anticipation and minimizes risk by adjusting position and speed to create precious space and time.

But what does an intersection look like? Not all traffic junctions are traditional four-way crossroads. In developed areas, the local gas station may be the busiest and most frenetic intersection in town-especially those biggie-sized gas/convenience stores popping up everywhere.

Unlike the traditional intersection where vehicle drivers have limited turning options, the gas station has multiple entrances and exits as well as undefined paths of travel within the fueling compound. This creates a free-for-all and challenges the rider to determine where any given threat may come from.

Avoidance begins before you get there. Look for gas stations in the distance. Actively scan for vehicles on the highway that may turn across your lane, while also scanning for vehicles moving within the fuel stop that could present a moving threat.

Be aware there are multiple things demanding a driver's attention near gas stations. Other vehicles entering and exiting, the flow of highway traffic and even intangibles like concerns of being late for work. All of these make a rider even less noticeable to motorists.
