# Merry almost-Christmas, friends!

I confess, I am one of those people who looks forward to Christmas every year. Even though Walmart and Lowes put out the Christmas decorations too early. Even though it is WAY over-commercialized. Even though it brings with it the traditional mini-uproars about the latest Starbucks cup, and mini-arguments over whether the cashier cheerfully wishes us "Happy Holidays" or "Merry Christmas." I still love it. I love the decorations, I love the music, I love the special meals and traditions. The Christmas tree lighting in downtown Fallon just the other day literally made me cry.

But it hasn't always been that way. There have been years when it was much harder to enjoy the season, when grief was too raw, money too tight, life too full of stress and trouble. I know that some of you reading this right now might be feeling that way, too. "A Christmas Carol" was always a staple at our house, growing up. My mom's favorite had Albert Finney as Scrooge, but we watched almost every single version at one point or another. Muppets, Mickey, Bill Murray, Patrick Stewart, Jim Carrey. Scrooge, as we know, is not a lover of Christmas. He has griefs and regrets of his own, that have turned into cold bitterness. At one point, annoyed with the kindly cheerfulness of it all, he snarls: "If I could work my will, every idiot who goes about with 'Merry Christmas' on his lips should be boiled in his own pudding, and buried with a stake of holly through his heart!"


Now, this isn't an overtly Christian story. It doesn't mention Jesus at all, I don't think. And yet, God is in it, all over it. In his bitterness, God finds him, and cares for him, and offers him redemption. When he meets the ghost of Christmas present, Scrooge emerges from his cold, gray, cheerless room to find a huge, laughing giant surrounded by light and greenery and good food, and he says, "Scrooge, you don't know me or any of my brothers who came before me. Look!! Look upon me and know me better, man!" The Psalmist says nearly the same thing to us: taste and see that THE LORD IS GOOD.


This Christmas, whether the season may find us joyful, or struggling, celebrating or dreading, there is maybe no better advice for us: to look around, and know God better. After the food, behind the lights, apart from the glitter and tinsel, to know the God who surrounds us with sights and touches and tastes of goodness every single day. As we hear again the profoundly important stories of a virgin mother, and a prophecy, and a miracle in the form of a child born in the simplest, humblest possible way, may we remember that it is God's joy to make miracles for us in ordinary things. In ordinary people. In ordinary life. Taste and see that the Lord is good.




