Happy Easter, beloved!

The greatest story ever told, the greatest event in history, the most important moment in the lives of those who knew Jesus and (though they wouldn't have really understood that at the time) of every one of us who has known Jesus since then...



By the Numbers Income Year to Date (Jan-Feb) \$23,678 **Expenses** YtD (Jan-Feb) \$27,235 We had a few once-per-year expenses in these first months which have put us a bit behind. To account for these and the typical yearly increases in things like utilities, we do need to raise about 5-10% more this year for the general fund (that is, separate from the building fund, mortgage, or other special things). It sounds like a lot, but that's only \$10-\$20 extra per month from each adult! If you are able, we hope you will consider increasing your giving. If you are not able, please don't worry! As the Bible tells us, each gives what they can, and God does the rest. Amen!
