I realize that God has a sense of humor, and so I hesitate to say this out loud...but I think it's finally spring! Happy Springtime, friends!

This is one of my favorite springtime Bible verses, from the Song of Solomon, chapter 2: "Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away; for now the winter is past, the rain is over and gone. The flowers appear on the earth; the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land. The fig tree puts forth its figs, and the vines are in blossom; they give forth fragrance. Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away."

I remember pieces of a song I once sang with a choir, that had these words in it...so beautiful. Just the thought of green and growing things, of creation waking up and taking a deep breath and doing the work of life brings me a deep feeling of contentment. I hope it does something like that for you, too.

I was very blessed recently to travel with Dennis to Denver to visit my best high school friend Kathy, and see some excellent baseball games — one in winter, with snow and freezing temperatures, dressed in several layers, gloves and hats; and one in spring, THE VERY NEXT DAY, where we were sweltering and got sunburned. Anyway, Kathy and Brian's kids are all still at home, but getting older (her oldest, Alex, is off to college this fall) and watching them be parents, and talking about parenting with them, has me thinking about our legacy. We shared stories about parents and grandparents, and the things we used to do together, the things they said that we still carry with us. We talked together about parenting, and the kinds of memories we want our kids to have, the kinds of people we hope they will grow up to be. The joy and the terror of parenting.:-)

What legacy are we leaving? What lessons are our kids learning about life from us? What experiences are giving them a firm foundation to stand on, while they navigate their own lives?

Our conversations in Denver were about all kinds of things that we teach our kids, intentionally and otherwise. But this is an excellent, and vitally important question for us as a church, too: What will the kids in our family, in our church, and in our community learn about God, based on what they know about us? Are we glad that they are here? Is our church a place they feel safe, cared for, and free to ask questions and find good answers from spiritually healthy people, who are humble enough to admit it when we don't know the right answer, and generous enough to commit to finding the answers with them?

I think we are. I have seen many of you treating the kids here with love and affection, guidance and gentle good humor. It is a joy to see it. As we continue to be the church together, I pray that you make the care and spiritual education of children one of your own highest priorities, inside the church and outside it. After all, you may be the only Bible a child ever reads.


