#### THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Hello friends!

It is a glorious green and growing summer so far in beautiful Fallon, Nevada. I love seeing the corn and alfalfa growing, the Farmer's Market getting more and more full downtown on Fridays, and all of the unique summer-specific ways that we can be the church. Like hosting our very first Interfaith BBQ/Water Balloon Volleyball game at Oats Park, which was so well-received that I can't wait to do it again. Like hosting our first Vacation Bible School in years, which was such a joy to do, and for which I am still tremendously thankful to our volunteers. Like acting like goofballs on our July 4 parade float, just to spread a little love to friend and stranger. And like attending Annual Conference every year in mid-June, to pray and worship and dream and plan with United Methodists all over northern Nevada and northern California...and, by extension, with all of those United Methodists who are holding their own Annual Conferences all over the world this time of year.

It's powerful, all of this. On paper, maybe it doesn't sound like it. But in the experience, you feel the Holy Spirit move.

In worship recently, we talked a little bit about the meaning of shalom. It is usually translated "peace," but it means much more than that. It means wholeness, healing, harmony, tranquility...a bringing together of broken parts, a meeting of opposites even. Much bigger than peace in the way we think of it, shalom is what fills the Kingdom of God and makes it beautiful. Shalom is what removes walls, and gathers all peoples together. Shalom is not just the absence of conflict; it is the presence of God.

Shalom is what God promised us through the prophet Isaiah and later fulfilled in Jesus Christ, where we read: "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." *Is 9:6* 

It's what Jesus was describing in the parable of the Prodigal Son, of the Good Samaritan, of the house built on rock.

It's what Jesus was living into, and leading us into, when he reached out to the sinner and the outcast. When he promised comfort to the mourning, humility to the rich and powerful, and the Kingdom to the poor and the meek. When he fed the thousands with spiritual food, and taught them to feed each other. When he healed the leper and the blind man and the bleeding woman. When he turned over the tables in the temple. When he forgave those who sought to destroy him.

It's what Jesus promised the Holy Spirit would bring, after his death and resurrection: "But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." *John* 14:26-27

It's what the disciples received when that promise was fulfilled at Pentecost, that gave them the courage to proclaim what they knew about Jesus to a crowd of foreigners; it's what the listeners received, that allowed them to hear and understand. It's what built the church from that moment, and what builds it still. Shalom.

It is an incredibly powerful thing. The stuff of Good News. And we find it whenever we let down our guard and love each other in the name of Jesus Christ. Which is why a simple game of water balloon volleyball with strangers from other faiths can be world-changing: because "whenever two or three or more are gathered in my name, there I am among them." *Mt 18:20* 

It's the little things that change the world, beloved.

# Did you know?

Aubrey Kaiser was born in Fallon, just one block west of our present day church. He lived his entire life in Fallon, with the exception of his time serving in the army in WWII. He once said his experiences in WWII brought him closer to God. He worked in several jobs around Fallon during the great depression,, even occasionally helping his father, who was the local "undertaker" at the time. After the war, he worked for the City of Fallon, and finally for the Postal Service as a letter carrier for over 30 years, starting when mail men walked for miles carrying the mail in a large bag slung over their shoulder, to the time they started driving the present little trucks for delivery. Aubrey attended the Methodist Church all his life, joining at the age of 12. He served this church in many ways, from the Men's Group to usher, until his death at age 85 in 1997.
