
ceremonies of gratitude and love. I tend to think we do.







#### CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY AUGUST 2018

Your Epworth UMC Church Council met on Wednesday, August 22 at 7:00pm. We heard reports from the Worship, Education, Staff-Parish Relations Committee, Fallon Daily Bread, Hospitality, Evangelism, Lay Leadership, and other ministry teams, and celebrated our ministries together. Financially, Epworth is doing fairly well, and we gave thanks for those who have gone above and beyond to donate to special projects during the year like the new bibles we filled our church with last year, several thousand dollars toward our mortgage principal, and the new hearing-assisted sound system in our sanctuary. We are so grateful!

Though all of our bills and program expenses are paid, our income is a bit lower than it was a year ago and thus we have not been paying our church tithe to the Conference. We are in conversation together about the importance of this tithe, and how we can cut expenses and increase income so that we can pay it.

The Council voted that, beginning this fall, Epworth will spend the next year focusing special fundraising on one project rather than several: paying off (or significantly paying down) the Wolf Center Mortgage. Doing so will eliminate our nearly \$1800 per month mortgage payment, and thus allow us increased financial health. We are excited about this! We think we can inspire our Fallon community to participate in this, too, considering the services we are able to provide our community thanks to the Wolf Center. Stay tuned to hear more about this! And we hope to see you at our next Council meeting, in October.
