## The Pastor's Corner

Hello Epworth UMC and friends!

I have always said, you know when you've had a good vacation when you are excited to get back to work. Dennis and I had a wonderful January, and I am VERY excited to get back to work! I have a list a mile long of things I didn't quite finish before Christmas, important things to get started, and new inspirations to talk with you about. I am so deeply grateful for all of you who took care of things and ministered to each other and led worship while I was away. I can't wait to hear how God showed up.

As for me, a couple of weeks ago, the first of my babies got married. I had the incredible blessing of officiating at her wedding, and it is all a blur. 24 hours later, we were on our way to Israel with what became a group of 40 Methodists from Nevada, California, Pennsylvania, and Georgia. It was a 2 week trip, and it's kind of a blur, too. January is going to take some time to process...every day, there is a different piece that quietly asks for my attention, that wants to be turned over and looked at more deeply, from different angles.

There is a lot that this Epiphany season has brought so far. I am willing to bet that is true for many of you, too. As God continues to speak to me through all of it, I look forward to sharing it all with you. And I look forward to hearing how God is moving in your life, too. Because one of the big things I am taking away from my own new experiences is the meaning of family. The big, deep, complex, mysterious power of "us."

Every wedding I am blessed to be a part of, including my daughter's, reminds me that God in infinite wisdom designed us to be together. Designed us to be US. The whole first chapter of Genesis describes God's good creation and how interrelated and fully God-made every part is, and how good and VERY good it is; and then in Genesis 2:18 we find the very first \*not good\* thing:

***"It is not good that the human being should be alone."***

From the very beginning, God designed us to be together. To need each other, and to be needed. But it's a complicated thing. Marriage is complicated. Family is complicated. Communities, nations, governments, they are all complicated. Ancient beginnings and breakings and endings, changes and traditions, it's all messy. But God made us this way for a reason: it is in this messiness that we grow and mature, that we learn the meaning and importance of things like humility, selflessness, listening, righteousness, and love. It is in this messiness that we find God.

We will be talking a lot about this in worship this month, and at other times and places too. In the meantime, you might like to take some time this month to read the book of Acts, especially the first few chapters, and research Dr Martin Luther King Jr's idea of what he called "the beloved community." And prayerfully ask yourself, what if? And what can I do in my own life, to move toward God's ideal?

This community of ours is an incredible blessing, beloved. I pray that you are finding God in your own opportunities for growth: God's strength when you're faced with something difficult, and God's presence and power when life is good. Because you are not alone, friends. And wherever 2 or 3 or more are gathered in Jesus' name, he is present there with you.



## Children in Worship

I was recently concerned by an article shared to me on social media. The story involved a pastor of a fairly large congregation (according to his own assessment, there were 250-300 people present during the following story) and a mother with her young child. During a sermon in a regular Sunday morning worship service, after what fellow worshipers described as "barely a peep" from the child, the pastor stopped in his tracks and asked the ushers to help him out by showing the mother to the nursery. He defended himself, saying things like "I'm not going to affect 300 people because of a crying child." I can only imagine how humiliated that new mom must have felt being addressed like that, especially in front of an audience of hundreds.

Yes, we are called to teach our children to be reverent and show respect to the worship experience; however, Jesus also said, "let the little children come to me, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (Matt. 19:14)
