joyful, love-filled Kingdom it is meant to be.

For weeks now, we have journeyed together in that season of waiting and preparation that we call Advent. Personally, it is a season that I love dearly. I love making or hunting for unique gifts, I love being surrounded by opportunities for generous living, I love being inspired by the ways people reach beyond themselves to do something special for friends or strangers in need this time of year. I love the lights and colors and smells and sounds that set the season apart as something special, and special events like the Christmas tree lighting downtown, and the choir cantata, and the children's program. As over-busy and stressful as it can be, it is a favorite time of year for me.

But for all of our focus on that season leading up to Christmas Day, it is the time after Christmas that is really the point. This season here, right now, after the celebrations are complete and the mess is cleaned up and the world slows down into a lovely peaceful rhythm. The lights and colors that stay up until Epiphany on January 6 seem to lose their manic intensity and gain a more peaceful glow. Even for the world that knows little of Jesus Christ and the power of Emmanuel, it is a time of deep satisfied breathing, not just that something has ended or been completed, but that something new is beginning. While the rest of the world senses a hint of God's grace and is inspired to make New Year's resolutions in an attempt to be better human beings, we who know Jesus celebrate his miraculous birth and all that it means: God, in the flesh, truly with us and for us, binding up our broken hearts and forgiving our sin, lending us the power not only to be better human beings but also to transform all the world to the peaceful, hopeful,

This time of year is all about beginnings. On January 6, we remember the arrival of the Magi: travelers from another nation and a different religion, who nonetheless recognized the presence of God in the child Jesus, and worshipped him. That event, so essential to the Christmas story, marks the beginning of the fulfillment of God's promise to share the Good News with every nation. On the second Sunday in January, churches traditionally remember Jesus' baptism, and the beginning of his ministry. And for us, the entire season is called Epiphany, when we look for and find times and places where the light of God is breaking through to light our path and guide us in new directions.

All of this is expressed powerfully in the vows we make at our baptism. Maybe in the coming year, we can renew our focus on those promises we make to God and each other:

- Do you renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of your sin?
- Do you accept the freedom and the power God gives you to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves?
- Do you confess Jesus Christ as your Savior, put your whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as your Lord, in union with the church which Christ has opened to people of all ages, nations, and races?

This month, I will be spending the first two weeks preparing for my daughter's wedding, and the second two weeks in the Holy Land with members of Epworth, and together with the pastors and members of Portola UMC and Antioch UMC. We will be renewing our baptism in the River Jordan together, and I am so looking forward to all that we will learn and experience together. I hope to be able to send messages to you from there, and to record a message via Facebook Live just like we do on Sunday mornings. Worship in January will be led by our inspiring and skilled friends and neighbors, and pastoral concerns will be capably handled by our many lay servants: Doug Coval, Margaret Knox, Jim and Sharon Foster, Ron Evans, Barbara McGarity, Jim and Barbie Hertz. 

US Flag Retirement Ceremony



This past Veterans' Day evening, Boy Scout Troop 1776, also known as "Troop Independence" conducted the "Mother of all flag retirement ceremonies" at Churchill County Fair Grounds. The theme of the

event was twofold, to honor our nations veterans and to respectfully retire American flags that have past their useful life.

The troop collects and receives worn flags throughout the year and normally retires a dozen or so every campout. But over the years, the inventor of used flags has dramatically increased to the point where this special ceremony retired over 1,300 American flags. The special event was organized by passed Scout Master, and current Assistant Scout Master, Steve Cathey (retired Navy aircraft maintenance technician). The narrator for the

event was Troop Parents' committee chairman, Jim Steele (retired Army Ranger). Overall fire safety was generously provided by the NAS Fallon's federal fire department.

Scouting is a program for boys that builds character, trains them in the responsibilities of participating citizenship, exposes them to outdoor activities, teaches resourcefulness, builds confidence and develops person-
