The Pastor's Corner

Hello church family!

Last week marked the 171st meeting of the California-Nevada Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. As every year, we prayed, sang, and worshipped together. We heard from our Bishop Minerva Carcano about the state of the church. We ordained and commissioned new pastors and missionaries, and gave thanks for those who retired from their work for Jesus Christ in the United Methodist Church. And, as everywhere, we had important conversations together and voted on matters important within the church and outside it.

I was particularly inspired when we heard from several speakers, including our Bishop, who emphasized how conservative and progressive believers need each other, and how important it is that we honor each other's beliefs and respect each other's ministries...how vital it is that we put aside arrogance and self-righteousness and learn from each other. Many spoke against the Traditional Plan because it is antithetical to that goal. In the evenings we were separated into small groups to talk together, and I found it to be a really helpful exercise in hearing each other's stories and learning where each other's beliefs came from. Even when we differed on issues of human sexuality, we found that we had far more in common than that which divides us.

Below are some words from your delegates — Kathy Fraker, Doug Coval, and Kenny Coval — describing their experience and impressions. We hope to speak to you in person on July 14 after worship, so that we can answer your questions more fully than we can here in this space. In the meantime, we pray that you are inspired to give praise and thanks to God for all God is doing in and through the worldwide church, and to continue to pray for God's guidance and blessing on us all.

The theme of the Annual Conference Session (ACS 2019) was With Jesus in the Boat, referring to Matthew 8:23-27, when Jesus was sleeping in the boat and a great storm arose and the disciples were afraid. Many nautical references were used throughout the Conference by many of the speakers to note the "storms" of life that we are presently "sailing in and through".

Bishop Carcano gave the opening address and gave a moving speech on the subject of getting in and being in the boat with Jesus. "Only Jesus decides who gets in the boat with him, only he can call those to him, just like he called his disciples." We must be obedient to his calling, no matter who we are.

During the Laity Session, Micheal Pope, Conference Lay Leader, and others introduced Intentional Discipleship and Vocational Ministry. Intentional Discipleship involves growing our faith through study and a developing a Christian lifestyle, while Vocational Ministry calls us to be disciples in our work places to draw others to Jesus.

Congratulations United Methodist Women on 150 years in Mission! President Marlene Ward gave an exciting report on UMW and encouraged all women to get involved.

ACS is a time when church clergy and laity (non-clergy members of the church) get together to do the work and business of the church which includes electing delegates to Western Jurisdictional Conference and General Conference for 2020. Also, voting on submitted resolutions which included 3 church closures, but several new church starts as well. Of course, there were resolutions concerning the Traditional Plan and the Book of Discipline adopted by General Conference at a special session in 2019. Other resolutions concerning the death penalty, parole for non-violent drug offenders, children of Gaza, ending border child incarceration, and other Social Justice issues were discussed as to what the UMC's role should be and then voted upon.

Most of all, the Annual Conference is a time for churches to come together and celebrate what we are doing together as a connectional church! Several connectional ministries are UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) and GBGM (General Board of Global Ministries), which each gave a presentation on their work and missionaries around the world. We can do so much more together than on our own! There is so much more I could write about, but I will report more when I do my in church report. Kids' Sunday School and most of our adult Sunday School classes go on Summer break beginning June 12. See you in the Fall!


