#### The Pastor's Corner

Hello Epworth and friends!

Ya know how when you're reading the Bible, or hearing it in worship, and for some reason a very familiar part strikes you in a completely new way? That happened to me the other day, as I was preparing for Ash Wednesday. It was this passage:

But when you pray, go into your inner room, close the door and pray to your Father who is in secret, and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you." ~Matthew 6:6

As I read it, it rang a bell in me. It connected with a hundred other bells that have been ringing in me lately, over the past few weeks, most of which I don't even remember. Pray, it said. Find a place in the quiet, a new place, different from what and where you usually pray.

This teaching of Jesus comes in the midst of a long sermon calling for deeper, more authentic faith. In response, religious people in the early church (and today, too) took this advice and set aside a small, dark space like a closet in their homes where they could go to pray. John Wesley is known to have spent the first 2 hours of every day in a space like this, beginning at 4am. (I was reading recently that his mother Susanna, not having the benefit of such a space within their home and maybe being a bit hesitant to lock herself away in a closet with so many children running around, just threw her apron over her head and sat in a kitchen chair to pray.)

Our guide in Israel, Nader, mentioned this passage when we visited Capernaum. As we looked at the stone remnants of homes and neighborhoods in the area of what was probably Peter's mother-in-law's home, he explained that the front room of the average home was for guests to be welcomed and shown hospitality. The next room in was the sleeping area and/or kitchen area, and then at the back of the home the storage area and stable. The word Jesus uses in the passage about praying in secret refers to this store room: quiet and dark, certainly humble, and not part of the busy-ness of the ordinary day. Jesus' instruction here is not about setting aside a special prayer room but about ensuring yourself uninterrupted space and privacy.

Prayer closets are still cool, though.

As a child growing up in a big, noisy family, I fantasized about living in a tiny house in the woods with only God and the animals for company. Or in a monastery, with other people to eat and worship and work with, but where you almost never speak. Though that is definitely not my calling, it turns out, part of me still yearns for the quiet, the solitude, and the uninterrupted time with God. (My dear husband doesn't know what to think when I say stuff like this.) I think this is the bell that keeps ringing in me lately, reminding me of the church bells that still call the faithful all around the world to prayer. So during Lent, I am making a special effort to make room for that in my own life: an inner room in my home and my time, to attend to the inner room of the heart.

All of us are made differently, and so your own yearnings might be very different, but this need to attend to the inner room of the heart is a universal thing. Only you and God will know what your own heart most needs... whether it is a new kind of service, a stretch in giving, a time of fasting, a commitment to more regular Bible study or worship, or something else. Whatever it is, the point is to make room: to be vulnerable and even a bit afraid, so that space is made in your heart to be face to face with God.

However you choose to spend this time, know that God will join you in it, and will make your inner room a place of joy and peace, "vast, spacious, and plentiful" (*Teresa of Avila*, 1515-1582).




