


## The Pastor's Corner

### Hello friends and family of Epworth UMC!

I was at a Rotary Club meeting the other day, listening to a young woman talk about her process of creative writing and self-publishing (I think she said that she has written 17 books? Somewhere around there), when she said something about her characters telling her about themselves as she writes rather than the other way around. I have heard other authors say this, too, about how the characters tell her what they would do or say in certain circumstances, or about how the story itself takes on a life of its own and the author simply follows it. Never having written that sort of thing, I don't claim to understand it, and yet I do know that when I am writing an article or essay or sermon I do often find myself ending up where I did not originally intend to go. I find inspiration comes sometimes in the middle of writing, as my fingers touch the keys. I just blame it on God, when it happens. Or at least, I rely on the hope that it's God.

Anyway, I find that prayer and prayerfulness keeps finding its way into my writing and preaching a lot lately. The importance of it. The results of it. The peace found in it. So much so that I decided to preach an entire sermon on it, and promptly realized that there was WAY too much to say to fit into our allotted time. Great stuff about people in the Bible who pray, even when like Daniel during the Babylonian captivity, and like the early Christians persecuted by both religious purists and Roman authorities - it put their lives at risk. The beautiful and important way prayer infused the spiritual life of Biblical Jews, so that even the most mundane tasks like cooking, cleaning, and eating became sacred things. The way the Shema placed on the doorpost, on the hand, and on the forehead creates a prayerful pause during the day's dealings - going out, coming home, doing business, encountering friend and stranger to center one's life on loving the Lord our God with all our heart, mind, soul, and strength. The different benefits of recited prayer and spontaneous prayer from the heart. The different benefits of private and public prayer. Different methods of prayer, for those who feel they don't know how, and for those who need new ways to pray to re-invigorate their prayer life. Too much to fit into this space, too!

Jesus' disciples wondered about prayer, too. Jesus' answer in that moment was to give us the Lord's Prayer (you can find it in Matthew 6, and Luke 11), but Jesus' example and teachings about prayer are much broader and deeper than just that. Based on all of that, and on powerful examples of prayers in my own life and in Christian history, it seems to me that just a couple of things are most important in our prayer life. One, that prayer be honest, humble, thankful, and frequent. Two, that we should pray expecting miracles...knowing that the miracles most often happen in our own heart as it becomes more fully aligned with the heart of God.

What happens when we pray? God does. God happens. In us, and in the world. Expect to be awed.


